- 4. Anatomy and physiology of the oral cavity and salivary glands. Diseases of the oral cavity. Examination of the oral cavity.
- 5. Anatomy, physiology and clinical examination of salivary glands. Sign and symptoms, diagnostic tests (USG, CT, RTG, BAC) and management of the salivary gland diseases; neoplasms of the salivary glands.

- 7. Diseases of the pharynx. Presentation of clinical cases.
- 8. Acute laryngeal dyspnea. Diagnosis, differential and management. Cricothyrotomy, tracheotomy. Performing tracheotomy on cadaver.
- 9. Anatomy and physiology of the inner ear (hearing and balance). Vertigo. Examination techniques (otoscopy, ENG, VNG, balance tests)
- 10. Diseases of the external and middle ear. Surgical and pharmaceutical treatment. Presentation of clinical cases.
- 11. Hearing disorders types, causes. Hearing assessment.
- 12. Objective hearing tests. Demostration of tympanometry, DPOAE, ABR.
- 13. Anatomy and physiology of the larynx. Diseases of the larynx. Examination techniques. Videostroboscopy.
- 14. Laryngeal oncology. LIN. Laryngeal cancer. TNM classification. Treatment (surgical, radiotherapy). Presentation of clinical cases.
- 15. Diseases of the esophagus. Foreign bodies.
