1. Historical outlook on violence against children and other forms of abuse. Classification of violence forms:

Shaken Baby Syndrome (SBS), Battered Child Syndrome (BCS), Neglected Child Syndrome (NCS) and Munchausen Syndrome by Proxy (MSBP). Forms of NCS, Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS).
